# TMP9R01 Evaluation Module



# **Description**

The TMP9R01EVM is designed to provide a quick setup to evaluate the TMP9R01SEP device and gain familiarity with the device down to the bit-by-bit register level. In addition to testing the device for common functionality, the EVM also allows testing under radiation specifically for Signal Event Lookahead (SEL) Testing. The EVM allows users to evaluate the performance of the TMP9R01 digital temperature sensor under space conditions.



### 1 Evaluation Module Overview

#### 1.1 Introduction

The EVM comes in a USB stick form factor, with an onboard MSP430F5528 microcontroller that interfaces with both the host computer and the TMP9R01 device. The module is designed with perforations between the sensor and host controller on the EVM board. The perforation allows the user flexibility in evaluation:

- The user can connect the TMP9R01 to the user's system or host.
- The user can connect the EVM host and software to the user's system with TMP9R01 devices.
- Small individual boards allow the user to place sensors in the user's system.
- Hole spacing is compatible with common 0.1" prototyping breadboards.

This user's guide describes the characteristics, operation, and use of the TMP9R01 Evaluation Module (EVM). A complete schematic diagram, printed-circuit board layouts, and bill of materials are included in this document. This user's guide details through the steps to operate the TMP9R01 evaluation module.

#### 1.2 Kit Contents

# 1.3 Specification

The absolute maximum thermal conditions of each section of the EVM are listed in Table 1-2. The main two sections are the controller section and the sensor breakable section. These limits must be considered when evaluating the performance of the device at extreme temperatures. In this case, if the setup conditions exceed the controller absolute maximum thermal specifications, then the sensor breakable section must be detached so that only the sensor (and not the MCU) is evaluated at these temperatures.

#### 1.4 Device Information

The TMP9R01 is radiation hardened, high-accuracy, low-power remote temperature sensor monitor with a built-in local temperature sensor. The remote junctions are typically low-cost, discrete, NPN or PNP transistors or substrate thermal transistors that cant be integrated parts of microprocessors, microcontrollers, or field-programmable gate arrays (FPGAs). Temperature is represented as a 12-bit digital code for both the local and remote sensors, providing a resolution of 0.0625C. The two-wire serial interface accepts the SMBus communication protocol with up to nine different pin-programmable addresses. Some of the parameters of interest in the TMP9R01 to consider when using this EVM is shown in Table 1-3.

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#### 2 Hardware

#### 2.1 Overview

The EVM is divided into two sections: the controller section and the breakable sensor section. The breakable sensor section can be detached to use the sensor in the following scenarios:

- Using the controller section with the sensor section connected by soldered wires and connectors to evaluate the sensor far from the controller and PC at extreme temperatures or other conditions.
- Using the sensor section with the user's system by interfacing through I2C with the TMP9R01.
- Using the controller section with TMP9R01 sensors in the user's system.




Figure 2-1. TMP9R01EVM Board Sections

The EVM sections and some components that must be identified by the user to understand the purpose and use are highlighted in Figure 2-1. The components are further explained in detail in the sections below.

### 2.2 Perforations and Connectivity

The perforation between the USB controller and TMP9R01 sensor is labeled on both sides for pin connections. Once the sensor section is detached from the controller section, the user can interface with the sensor section in two different ways:

• Soldering wires or 0.1" header connectors: With this approach, the user has access to all pins of the device.

#### Note

When interfacing with other controller boards, TI recommends to verify that pullup resistors and protection circuitry are present on any controller board for safe and proper functionality.

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## 2.3 Status LEDs (D3, D5, D6) and Subregulator

The switch S1 enables and disables the onboard 3.3V regulator: U5. When the subregulator is enabled, the green LED D3 illuminates. The subregulator must be enabled for normal operation of TMP9R01EVM as the subregulator supplies power to the device and pullup voltage of the communication lines.

The red LED D4 is the MSP430F5528 status LED. The different modes of operation are displayed by the LED status and are shown in Table 2-1.

Two additional LEDs are presented on the EVM. The D5 LED can indicate a THERM fault and turns on when the device detects a THERM fault and brings the pin LOW. D6 does the same function but for the ALERT/THERM2 pin. Both these LEDs are red.

# 2.4 Programming Header

The TMP9R01EVM comes pre-loaded with firmware that is necessary for the correct operation of the USB interface and PC GUI software. The unpopulated header, J2, is provided for Spy-Bi-Wire access to the MSP430F5528. TI does not recommend that users access this header or reprogram the device.

### 2.5 BSL Button

The TMP9R01EVM features push-button SW1 for entering USB BSL mode. This can be used for firmware updates. To enter USB BSL mode, connect the EVM to a PC USB port while holding down SW1.

### 2.6 Remote BJT - Q1

Q1 is a MMBT3904LP NPN BJT. This is used as the remote temperature sensor on the EVM. The MMBT3904LP typically has an N-factor of about 1.0042. The TMP9R01 assumes an N-Factor of 1.008, which can cause a temperature error in the remote temperature reading. The GUI automatically sets the N-Factor correction register to 1.0042 to compensate for this. If the device is reset, then the device sets the N-Factor correction register back to the default value or 1.008 and a temperature error can be seen. If a remote temperature error is seen, then use the N-Factor correction feature to adjust the temperature reading. The MMBT3904LP can also be broken off to allow the engineer to connect a different temperature remote to the device.

## 2.7 Address Jumpers

J3 and J4 are used for setting the I2C address of the TMP9R01. J3 is used to set the A0 pin, and J4 is used to set the A1 pin.

### 2.8 Current Measurement - SEL Measurement

This EVM provides two approaches in measuring the total quiescent current of the TMP9R01 device. Within this section of the EVM, there is a jumper and three test points: TP1, TP2, and GND.

Option 1: Measure the current through the resistor with known voltage measurements of TP1 and TP2. The jumper is in parallel with a resistor. To take advantage of this option, users need to remove the jumper and repopulate the resistor R21 with a value of your choice.


Option 2: Using a SMU to supply voltage and measure current through TP2 and GND. To take advantage of this option, remove R21 resistor, switch off the USB power through the Subregulator switch and supply TP1 and TP2 with the same voltage within the range of 1.7V to 3.6V.

When measuring current through this device, the following images show what to expect for the current output. There are different current ranges for what mode the device is in. Shutdown mode consumes the least amount of power vs active conversion mode consumes the most amount of power.



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

#### 3 Software

### 3.1 Software Installation

The PC GUI Software for TMP9R01EVM runs on TI's GUI Composer framework. The software is available as a live version, which runs in a browser, and is available as a download for offline use. The software is compatible with Windows, Mac, or Linux operating systems.

### 3.1.1 Live Software on dev.ti.com

The live software currently works on Chrome<sup>™</sup>, Firefox<sup>®</sup>, and Safari<sup>®</sup> browsers. Internet Explorer<sup>®</sup> is not supported. Users can access the live version through one of the following actions:

- Go to the TMP9R01EVM Product page on ti.com and click on the View button
- Go to dev.ti.com/gallery, log in with myTl account credentials, and search for TMP9R01EVM.
- Go to https://dev.ti.com/gallery/info/THSApps/TMP9R01EVM/.

Click the application icon within the gallery to launch the software. Agree to the prompts to install or update the TI Cloud Agent browser plug-in. The plug-in is necessary for connection to the USB hardware.




Figure 3-1. Plug-in Setup



### 3.1.2 Download from dev.ti.com




Figure 3-2. Download Pop-Up

Users can access the latest version of the offline software by navigating to the live version as noted above. Look for the download icon and download both the application and run time for the operating system as shown in Figure 3-2.

## 3.2 Home Tab

The *Home* tab is shown at software launch. The icons on the bottom of this tab are shortcuts to the other functional tabs of the GUI, and correspond to the icons on the left side of the GUI.




Figure 3-3. Home

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## 3.3 Data Capture Tab

The *Data Capture* tab reports the temperature from the TMP9R01 device included on the TMP9R01EVM. Temperature data is polled and displayed by default. By default, the MCU polls the registers with a 100ms delay. The CONVERT TEMP command (0x44) is sent automatically while polling. The polling rate setting on the *Data Capture* tab is synchronized with the polling rate setting on the *Registers* tab. The following features of the Data Capture Tab include:

- Reading the current temperature measurement from the TMP9R01 displayed in the upper right corner.
- Polling Rate drop-down menu is used to disable polling or change the polling rate.
- The Save Logging and Stop Logging buttons can be used to capture Temperature data and save the data to a CSV format.

When capturing data, please remember the following:

- For the online version of the GUI, a download begins in the browser. This download is lost if the GUI is closed.
- For the offline version of the GUI, the file is appended as data is received. In this case, appended data is not lost if the GUI is closed.

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# 3.4 Registers Tab

The Registers tab interacts with the registers and the bits within the TMP9R01 device. For more information on each register/bit, hover over the register name and click on the question mark to see what each bit defines.

By default, the MCU polls the registers with a 100ms delay and the table shows the current status of the registers and updates the changes in the table every poll. By clicking on the bits in the table, the user has the availability to change the bit to a 1 or 0. The Write Register buttons are grayed and disabled when the button is set to Immediate. Immediate mode triggers a Write operation each time a register is modified. When Deferred mode is selected and the Write Register button is enabled, write operations are not performed unless the Write Register button is clicked.

When Deferred mode is selected, the user can take advantage of the following:

- Write button writes the bit changes in the selected register.
- Write All button is used to write all bit changes in all registers.

When auto read is turned off, the table no longer updates and the user can take advantage of the following:

- Read button reads the current status of the selected register.
- Read All button is used to fetch the current contents of all registers at once.

These settings give the user total control over bus activity, and enable individual transactions to be easily observed with an oscilloscope, logic analyzer, or bus-sniffing device.




Figure 3-5. Registers




Figure 4-1. Schematic




Figure 4-2. PCB (Top View)




Figure 4-3. PCB (Bottom View)
